Department ID Chart Field	<ul> <li>Reviewed the pro and con list related to the department ID field.</li> <li>Discussed the use and length of department ID chart field as used by Georgia Tech and Georgia State.</li> <li>The revised recommendation for the department ID (DEPT_ID) chart field is a length of 8-digits.</li> <li>The recommendation is to go with option 2 which was to create a new department ID strategy.</li> <li>The new strategy recommended is: <ul> <li>* First two numeric digits will represent the college/school/unit</li> <li>* Next three numeric digits will represent the new department number</li> <li>* The last three digits (alpha numeric) will be determined by the department (can be used as a sub-department)</li> </ul> </li> <li>The department number will still be centrally managed as it is currently. Departments will submit a request for a new department to be added.</li> <li>Cliff mapped out how this department schema would look in a standard tree level structure. For tree purposes, the college/school/unit itself will be assigned a department number as a 'node' on the tree. This node level would not be used for transactions but for roll up purposes and potentially for budget purposes. The actual department and sub-departments would be a 'leaf' on the tree. This level is where transactions are processed. UGA will need to be consistent and set up the same tree level structure for all college/school/units no matter the size.</li> </ul>



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Project Id	<ul> <li>Examples were given to show how the project ID (PROJECT_ID) can be used across multiple funding sources.</li> <li>A common practice is for departments to allocate funds from various sources to faculty. Departments could establish a project ID for each faculty member, if they choose, to track these allocations whether they be from general funds, indirect cost recovery, etc. An example of using project ID in this manner are attached to these meeting minutes.</li> <li>The recommendation for the project ID field is that the length be 10-digits (alpha numeric) with the first digit begin as follows: C for capital projects</li> <li>S for sponsored projects</li> <li>F for foundation</li> <li>The remaining 9-digits for capital, non-sponsored, and foundation projects would be determined by the department. The remaining 9-digits of the project ID</li> </ul>
	for sponsored projects will be determined at a later date based on the grants module functionality.
Operating Unit	<ul> <li>In the first design session the recommendation was to use the operating unit (OPERATING_UNIT) for location.</li> <li>It was decided to recommend the operating unit chart field be a 3-digit alpha numeric field.</li> </ul>
